WWF - THE STATE OF ENGLAND'S CHALK STREAMS



A WWF report found that 77% of our chalk streams fail to meet WFD good status. Furthermore, only 12 out of 224 have protected status. Chalk streams face a number of pressures including pollution, over abstraction and channel modification. You can read the full report here >>
