## **HEXHAM FISH PASS** IS COMPLETED

In late October Hexham Fish Pass was opened just in time for the peak Salmon and Sea Trout migration period. Work started in May to give migratory fish an easier passage under Hexham Bridge which was a barrier to many fish. So far the structure has been a success with many fish seen passing through in the first few weeks of it opening. The good work is set to continue in the area as the installation of an eel pass is planned for next year.
