CATCHMENT PARTNERSHIP ACTION FUND (CPAF)

DEFRA have now allocated £4.7 million to Catchment Partnerships >> which will deliver WFD outcomes over the next year. Organisations in 106 Catchments have been allocated funding for projects with aims that include the implementation of diffuse pollution

measures, awareness raising campaigns and HMWB mitigation measures. The Environment Agency and RRC have been, and will be, working closely with the partnerships to ensure successful outcomes. The projects are due for completion in March 2016, when there will be significant ecological and community based improvements to report on.
