The Upper and Bedford Ouse Catchment Partnership is launching a River Wardens Scheme. The scheme will be led in the Gamlingay & Potton area by the Wildlife Trust BCN and Bedfordshire Rural Communities Charity, with support from the Environment Agency.

We are looking for local residents to become volunteer river wardens
It's a great way to get out and about and learn more about wildlife, your river and how to protect it.

Water is essential for everything we do.

That's why we are working towards improving the quality of all our rivers, lakes and ground waters for everyone to enjoy. Our rivers are a vital part of our environment and ecosystem and are at the heart of local communities.

River wardens can help by:

- Recording wildlife and river features – information which adds to our knowledge and helps to make good decisions.
- Monitoring wildlife including plants, invertebrates, otters, water voles and mink – understanding trends and looking for changes.
- Recording and alerting on pollution incidents – it's vital to respond quickly.
- Record invasive species particularly Himalayan Balsam and floating pennywort - so that action can be taken to deal with them.
- Fly tipping and littering – it's unsightly and threatens people, wildlife and fisheries.
- Recording localised flooding and other river issues which affect your community.

Volunteers can:

- Commit to as little or much time as they want.
- Choose the area that they want to monitor.
- Work in pairs or small groups.

River Wardens will be fully supported by Wildlife Trust BCN and BRCC staff and the Upper and Bedford Ouse Catchment Partnership (<http://ubocp.org.uk>), which includes the Environment Agency. All training and equipment will be provided.
