EUROPEAN GOOD PRACTICE WORKSHOP FOCUSES ON SHARING EXPERIENCES AND NEW PRACTICAL TOOLS



RESTORE took centre stage, following on from RRC's Annual Network Conference, on April 20th. The morning session featured talks on project assessment and monitoring design, and RRC's monitoring guidance [PRAGMO](#) was officially launched.

The afternoon featured presentations from Philip Weller, Executive Secretary of the International Commission for the Protection of the Danube River (ICPDR) and Jukka Jormola from the Finnish Environment Institute (SYKE). Participants were able to test a new online tool to document projects across Europe and the rest of the world for the first time, and discussions on the [new RESTORE website](#) aimed to ensure that the project delivers output and tools that make a real difference to river restoration.

The River Restoration Centre is the West Region lead organisation for the [EU LIFE+ RESTORE Information and Communication project](#) (2010-2013) which encourages the communication of sustainable river restoration best practice across Europe.
