RESTORE ENGAGEMENT EVENTS

A [RESTORE](#) western region workshop was held in Paris during November, to discuss how policy might better target river restoration techniques. Representatives from England, Scotland, Republic of Ireland, France Denmark and the Netherlands were in attendance. It provided a great opportunity to swap ideas and discuss issues that were of mutual concern. Better linkages between land and water policy and spatial planning were highlighted as some of the key factors that limited current work. The full outputs from this workshop will be available on the RESTORE and RRC websites in the new year.

On the 8th and 9th March 2012, we will be holding another event in Arnhem, Netherlands. The theme for this workshop is 'Spatial planning and conflicting land use requirements'.




GEOMORPHOLOGY POSTS AT THE EA
