CATCHMENT RESTORATION FUND & EXTERNAL FUNDING

Catchment Restoration Fund (CRF) Phase 1 funding awarded

A national panel has awarded funding to twenty nine projects as part of the first phase of the Catchment Restoration Fund (CRF). Nineteen charitable organisations comprising river trusts, wildlife trusts, and voluntary and river action groups have been awarded funding to carry out projects in England. These will restore rivers, lakes, wetlands, estuaries, coastal habitats and their surrounding landscapes to more natural conditions.

The CRF forms part of the Government's Water Framework Directive Programme, and further funding will be awarded subsequently. RRC worked with the Environmental Agency and a panel of technical assessors to review applications. Those received in the second phase are now being assessed.

RIVER NENE NATURE IMPROVEMENT AREA VACANCY 'RESTORATION ADVISER'

The River Restoration Centre is pleased to announce its involvement in one of the 12 Nature Improvement Areas (NIA) suggested by the Lawton Review '<u>Making Space for Nature</u>'. The 12 NIA will receive a share of £7.5 million to create wildlife havens, restore habitats and encourage local people to get involved with nature.

To realise this work over the next 3 years, the Wildlife Trust's NIA Manager will be supported by 4 posts which are currently being advertised. The River Restoration Adviser will be employed by RRC through Cranfield University, with the post based at the River Nene Regional Park.



Closing date for receipt of applications is 8th July 2012. Interviews will be held on 16th July 2012 in Northampton.

LINKING WETLAND, FLOODPLAIN & RIVER RESTORATION

Jenny Mant (Science and Technical Manager) outlines some of the outputs from the RESTORE workshop at the 7th Annual Meeting of the Society for Wetland Scientists (SWS) European Chapter in Aarhus, Denmark, held on the 20th June.

The workshop audience identified different approaches to linking wetlands and rivers to directly





address some of the issues that RESTORE has set out to address. Feedback included the need for:

- Clear messages & common terminology in expressing what is being delivered in projects that link wetlands and rivers (and the benefits).
- Better stakeholder communication.
- More dissemination of information regarding river and wetland projects across Europe. The development of the RESTORE wiki-tool will provide a good platform to ensure this is achieved.

Beyond the RESTORE workshop, the SWS conference also outlined recent research in wetland construction and restoration.

There was also an opportunity to visit the River Skjern restoration project (pictured).

The workshop, site visit and conference outputs will be available on the <u>RESTORE website</u> shortly.
