NOVEL APPROACH TO CHANNEL DIVERSION AND RECONNECTION ON PYL BROOK, SOUTH LONDON

Diversion of Pyl Brook at the Hamilton Recreation Ground has recently been completed with the use of a new approach to revetment, and restricting the new channel connection until vegetation has grown. Reeds have been given time to establish in the slightly deeper water of the low flow channel and the park will be officially reopened at Easter, with an information board to illustrate the positive steps taken to improve biodiversity to local people, who are said to be very vocal in their appreciation.
