

## RRC Site Visit Series River Trent, Staffordshire Trent Valley Wednesday 13<sup>th</sup> March 2024

Join us in Staffordshire to visit four urban restoration sites in Stoke-on-Trent. We will hear about partnership projects that helped win the 2023 UK River Prize, for the 'catchment-scale award'.

For 25 years Staffordshire Wildlife Trust and the Environment Agency worked with a host of partners to carry out over 100 river and floodplain restoration projects throughout the Trent River system in Staffordshire. The emphasis has been to design schemes that 'trigger' dynamic natural processes. For the RRC visit we aim to visit four of our urban restoration sites.



<u>Site 1. Staffordshire University</u>: a heavily engineered reach of the Trent was restored with split channels and backwaters and encouraged to connect with a wider area of the riparian zone.

<u>Site 2. Victoria Ground</u>: a visionary and ambitious scheme was completed at the site of the old Stoke City football ground. The River Trent was moved away from its concrete straight jacket and given a new, more naturalised course. The new channel also bypassed two weirs.

Sites 3 & 4. Weir Removals at Bucknall Park and Cromer Road: fish passage and the natural function of the River Trent through urban parts of Stoke was also enhanced through the removal of two further weirs at Bucknall Park and at Cromer Road.

## Information
