



Uploading a Case Study



Is the RiverWiki right for my project?

To create a case study, ideally you need a project that has been completed and has detailed information available. Here is a list of the basic information required for a RiverWiki case study:

- Project location
- Project status
- River name
- Themes / Drivers
- Country
- Project Picture
- Project contact (forename and surname) and organisation
- Project summary (at least one paragraph about the project)
- Project started date
- Project completed date (if known)
- Reasons for river restoration
- Measures / Techniques used



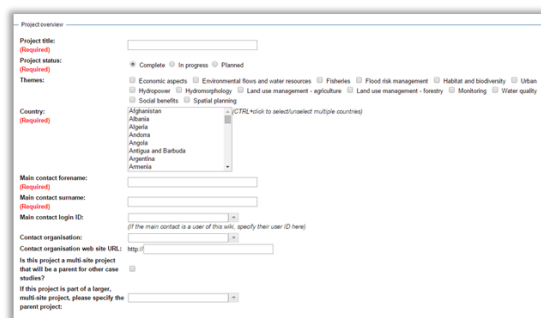
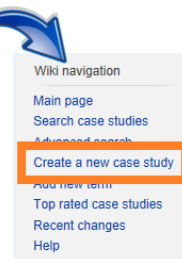
Create an account

Creating an account is very simple on the RiverWiki. The 'create an account' page can be found at the top right of the main page. It requires you to enter a **username**, **password**, **email** and **real name**. Once you have entered these, you are ready to add and edit projects!

Create a new case study

The 'create a new case study' page can be found in the navigation bar on the left of the page.

- The first thing you will have to do is add the location of your project. This can be done by clicking on the map, inserting Lat/Long, town name, post code or grid reference.
- You then have to add the basic information, such as project title, country and contact details. Once this is done, your project will be created.
- Next, you will be taken to your project page. There will be a line of red text saying that your project is not approved. To get your project approved you need to fill in a minimum amount of information.
- The fields required are at the top of this page. These fields can be found by scrolling down your project page. If you can't find a field, click the bullet points at the top of this factsheet to show it's location. Once you have completed the fields your project will await approval by RRC.
