




Why upload to the RiverWiki?



Share your success

- The RiverWiki is a great platform to share information about a project. You can add pictures, documents and links to websites. The possibilities are endless, so be creative!
- As an open Wiki site the RiverWiki can be viewed and edited by anyone. This means that you can easily update and share a project to interested groups.
- Because of this it is a great community engagement tool as volunteers and community groups can upload pictures and information that they have collected.
- RRC feature new RiverWiki projects in a monthly bulletin and also share projects across social media. It's a great chance for your project to get Europe wide recognition.



Contribute to the UK evidence base

- When you add a project to the RiverWiki it will be added to the National River Restoration Inventory (NRRI) by RRC. This is a bespoke database of over 4,000 projects which is used by a variety of groups involved in river restoration.



- The NRRI supports projects and studies with information on costs, specific techniques, geographical context, contacts and much more. Maintaining this level of information is important for learning and building best practice.
- Your project will also contribute to the growing resource that's freely available for people to view and learn from online. The search function is particularly useful. You can try a few examples below:



- This will help us to build capacity within the UK, to encourage involvement and allow people to feel confident in implementing best practice techniques.

How to upload
