



Working With Rivers

This workshop is for practitioners and planners wishing to gain an understanding of the processes that operate in rivers.

The workshop aims to introduce a non-specialist audience to river processes and the principles of good river management

Content

Through case study presentations, discussion and a site visit to Leys Estate, Banchory, the workshop will help individuals understand the active processes that operate within rivers and influence habitat provision:

- demonstrate, using a variety of projects, the active processes operating in rivers;
- create an awareness of enhancement and rehabilitation approaches to various situations;
- demonstrate the benefits of a partnership approach, involving a range of stakeholders, when planning or designing a scheme;
- build confidence to identify appropriate situations for intervention, and when and where to seek advice.

Staff from SNH and The River Restoration Centre will be available for discussion with individual delegates about specific river restoration casework.

This workshop is intended to assist those with CPD requirements. (NB. The responsibility for judging the relevance and value of events and other forms of CPD lies with the individual.)
