What is it about?

This two day practical workshop will help participants assess suitable locations for river restoration projects. Advice on planning and undertaking projects will be given. Technical information needed to ensure that a project is appropriate for its setting and is sustainable will be explained. Funding sources will be identified.

Participants will feel more confident about planning and managing river restoration projects. Much of the event will be delivered out of doors and participants will undertake some basic
