





## 2022 UK River Prize Finalists announced

The River Restoration Centre (RRC) awards the UK River Prize to celebrate the achievements of those individuals and organisations working to restore our rivers and catchments, and recognising the benefits to society of having a healthy natural environment.

After much deliberation the judging panel selected four finalists:

The 2022 UK River Prize winner will be announced at the Awards Dinner at Chesford Grange Hotel, Kennilworth on 28th June 2022. This runs in conjunction with the River Restoration Centre's Annual Network Conference which attracts over 200 delegates.
